MISSIONS MINUTE: 대한민국 Republic of Korea

POPULATION: 51,844,834 (2022 est.)
GEOGRAPHY: mostly hills & mountains; wide coastal plains in west and south
CAPITAL: Seoul
LANGUAGES: Korean, English
AVERAGE LIFE EXPECTANCY: 82.97 years
GOVERNMENT TYPE: presidential republic
RELIGIONS: none 56.9%, Protestant 19.7%, Buddhist 15.5%, Catholic 7.9% (2015 est.)

According to Korean legend, the country was organized in 2333 BC by a man called Tan’gun. Korea had ancient ties with China, from which it was influenced toward Confucianism and a centralized monarchy. Throughout the ages, power over the country would shift from one dynasty to another, eventually ending up under Japanese control in the early 20th century. During WWII, communists occupied the northern part of Korea while the US occupied the south. When the Japanese surrendered, ending WWII, the 38th parallel was chosen as a line of division between the Soviet-controlled north and the US-controlled south. Three years later, in 1948, two republics would officially form, South Korea (ROK) and North Korea (DPRK). Reunification of these republics remains a desire for many Koreans.

Following the Korean War (1950-53), South Korea quickly began to shift from a weak agrarian economy to an “industrial powerhouse with a highly skilled labour force.” (Britannica, 2023) Its economic boom has been widely referred to as the “miracle on the Han River.” (Harvard Business School) Today, South Korea is known among other things as a world leader in technology.
